MINUTES

A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:08 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions of members, staff, and guests. There was a quorum.

B. APPROVAL OF THE JUNE 15, 2023 MINUTES

Harry Fenton moved to approve the June 15, 2023 minutes. Brandon Bundy seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. ACTION ITEMS:

a. Amendment to the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program

Jennifer Sebesta highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. She said Norman was represented here today and could answer any questions they might have. There were no questions.

Justin Henry moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee amend the FFY 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program by updating the City of Norman FFY 2023 Transit Element with the attached program of projects and submitting the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Harry Fenton seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

b. Modifications to the Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG - UZA) Project Scoring Criteria and Procedures

Jennifer Sebesta highlighted the five STBG Subcommittee recommended modifications to the STBG - UZA project scoring criteria and procedures as detailed in the agenda memorandum.

Justin Henry asked if additional applications will be allowed. Mr. Sharp said they did not receive any strong language about that from the Subcommittee. He said ACOG currently allows 12 pre-applications and 10 final applications. ACOG's and ODOT's concern is if too many projects are allowed to be brought forward, can they be moved along quickly. He said if they have projects that can be packaged together (bundled), they can be flexible in that way. Matt VanAuken said if the projects are grouped together, they must be the same type of project. Mr. Henry asked if the grouped projects must be contiguous. Mr. Sharp said they must be in the same area.

Harry Fenton asked if they will have three pay quality sheets for each section of the grouped projects for the inspectors, or will it be one pay quality sheet. Brandon Dudgeon said they would not need three separate sheets.

David Riesland asked if the safety side of item #3 (the over programming of STBG-UZA funded projects) would be 10 percent of the old number, and not the new number. Ms. Sebesta said ODOT decided that it would be held at 10 percent of the original apportionment.

Brian Hiney said Edmond has an issue with item #4 of limiting the projects. Therefore, Joshua Johnston moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve the proposed changes for items 1, 2, 3, and 5 to the STBG-UZA Project Scoring Criteria and STBG-UZA Procedures. Brandon Bundy seconded the motion. The motion carried as follows:

David Riesland moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve the proposed change for item #4 to the STBG-UZA Project Scoring Criteria and STBG-UZA Procedures. Justin Henry seconded the motion. The motion carried as follows:

c. Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) Performance Measures and Targets

Lauren Wood highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. She noted that ACOG supports the same performance measures and targets as ODOT.

Joshua Johnston moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve the recommendation of supporting ODOT's system performance, bridge, and pavement condition performance measure targets as the targets for the ACOG MPO area. Mayor Terry Arps seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

 d. Resolution Designating the Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA) as the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 Program Recipient for the Urbanized Area

Hannah Nolen highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. She said that upon approval today, this item will go to the ACOG MPO Policy Committee. Upon approval, a resolution will be signed by all parties concerned, and ODOT will coordinate a letter to be signed by the Governor.

Mr. Sharp added that Jared Schwennesen informed him that the Oklahoma City urban area received \$1.22 million to do this planning work.

Christy Batterson asked, as Citylink is a subrecipient of COTPA, would they receive a direct apportionment from COTPA like they do with their 5307 funding or would they have to compete in a Call for Projects with everyone else. Ms. Nolen said her understanding was that it could be either/or, but it would be COTPA's call. Marilyn Dillon said Citylink will be actively involved in the planning process as they move forward.

Harry Fenton moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee adopt a resolution to recommend that the Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA) be a designated recipient of the FTA Section 5310 Program and its funds be apportioned to the Urbanized Area. David Riesland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

D. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

1. Project Development Process

John Sharp said Matt VanAuken, Program Manager from the Local Government Division of ODOT, was here today to give a presentation. The presentation can be viewed here: https://www.acogok.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/08/Matt-VanAuken-TAP-Project-Development-Process-Presentation-ACOG-8-17-23.pdf

Mr. Sharp said this process takes a great deal of coordination. He suggested that if the elected officials can see this presentation, it would help them know why projects take so long to complete.

2. Preliminary FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Jennifer Sebesta highlighted this information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. She said the final TIP would be presented next month.

3. Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG - UZA) - Call for Projects

Jennifer Sebesta noted that the Call for Projects opens September 1, 2023 and the changes to that program on the agenda today will go to the ACOG MPO Policy Committee at the end of August.

4. Air Quality Small Grant Program - Call for Projects

Hannah Nolen said this is just a reminder that the Call for Projects is open now and will close at 4 p.m. on Friday, September 29. Mr. Sharp said ACOG staff has met with some communities and said if others are interested in learning more about this program, to contact ACOG. Ms. Nolen said this is a two year program, so it will not be open again until 2025.

5. Clean Air for Public Sector Fleet Grant - Call for Projects

David Frick said this is also a reminder that the Call for Projects is open now and will close at 4 p.m. on Friday, September 29. He said eligible projects include alternative fueled vehicles and the charging and refueling infrastructures. For the vehicles, he said this grant will cover the environmental cost of a conventional vehicle and for the charging and refueling infrastructure, it is an 80/20 percent match. Since there is approximately \$4 million, now is the time to apply for big projects. Mr. Sharp noted that the program includes off-road equipment, which would include mowers.

Harry Fenton asked if the old equipment must be retired from the fleet. Eric Pollard said the old equipment can be auctioned.

6. National Summit on Rural Road Safety

Jose Jimenez highlighted the information about the 4th National Summit on Rural Road Safety in Oklahoma City as detailed in the agenda memorandum.

7. 2020 Census Definitions and Its Impact on the Urbanized Area Boundary

John Sharp said the Census Bureau defines urban areas in the United States, but the Federal Highway Administration uses the Census Bureau's definition to tie it to funding for each Transportation Management Area (TMA). He said in 2000, the Census Bureau separated the Oklahoma City urban area from the Norman urban area based on their definition of what an urban area was and how it was created. In 2002, the City of Norman and our local congressional delegation officially joined them back together for Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funds, but for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds, Norman remains separate. He said that for today, he was going to talk about the FHWA funds.

FHWA allows ACOG to create a rough area around the urban area to create an adjusted (smoothed) UZA. He said the preliminary boundary in the second map smoothes the UZA and possibly has an impact on ODOT in regard to urban area and rural area functional classification.

Mr. Sharp said to let ACOG know if they have any issues regarding where the boundary was placed. This adjusted UZA area will be for planning purposes over the next 10 years.

Mayor Arps noted that Luther was not even on the map, but asked why El Reno was not included. Mr. Sharp said that El Reno is an urban area, but fairly small and separated by quite some distance from the Oklahoma City urban area, much like Guthrie and Chickasha.

Joshua Johnston asked why Piedmont was not included. Mr. Sharp said it was due to the density of the housing units. Housing units in Piedmont are fairly spread out, so a lower density area would not be included by the Census Bureau. When Piedmont starts to develop with subdivisions rather than two to five acre lots, the density will increase. Mr. Sharp said density used to be about 1,000 population per square mile.

FINAL FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

INFORMATION:

In August, the preliminary FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was presented for review and comment. The preliminary TIP was developed with input from ACOG MPO local governments, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA), Norman Transit, the Oklahoma City Department of Airports, and other area airport operators.

The TIP identifies all federally funded surface transportation projects expected to be carried out by city, county, state, and local transportation agencies during federal fiscal years 2024-2027. This includes upcoming state-sponsored projects within the ACOG MPO area, under the jurisdiction of ODOT, upcoming transit projects provided by COTPA and Norman Transit, and proposed airport improvements provided by local airport operators.

Opportunity for public review and comment on the preliminary FFY 2024-2027 TIP was announced by public notice in The Oklahoman, a news release distributed to metro area media outlets, and on ACOG's website and social media suite. Written comments will be accepted through 4 p.m., Wednesday, September 20, 2023, at IIP@acogok.org and anyone may attend the September 28 ACOG MPO Policy Committee public hearing to express their opinions.

Following MPO approval, the final FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO TIP will be provided to the ODOT for approval (as the Governor's designee) and incorporated into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The new TIP will become effective at the start of the federal fiscal year on October 1, 2023.

ADJUSTED URBANIZED AREA BOUNDARY - 2020 CENSUS DEFINITIONS AND PROGRAMMATIC IMPACT

INFORMATION:

Following each decennial census, the U.S. Census Bureau designates "urban areas" for statistical purposes. A list of the 2020 urban areas can be found in the December 29, 2022 Federal Register. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) uses the term "urbanized area" to mean an area with a population of 50,000 or more designated by the Census Bureau.

These are the following FHWA programs that are impacted by the urbanized area boundary (at the state level):

- Highway Functional Classification (Urban/Rural)
- HPMS Reporting
- Critical Freight Corridors
- STBG Apportionment Formula
- STBG Special Rule for Areas Less Than 50,000
- CMAQ Traffic Congestion Performance Measures
- Control of Outdoor Advertising

The following planning issues are addressed by the Federal Highway Administration:

At a minimum, the MPO boundaries shall encompass the entire existing urbanized area (as defined by the Census Bureau) plus the contiguous area expected to become urbanized within a 20-year forecast period for the metropolitan transportation plan, per 23 CFR 450.312(a)(1). Therefore, it is most likely that the MPO would need to include the entire adjusted urbanized area.

The determination to adjust an urban area boundary is a State and local decision that should be made cooperatively between State and local officials and MPOs if the boundary is located within an MPO's MPA. Urban area boundary adjustments are subject to approval by the Secretary of Transportation, per 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(35) and 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(36), but FHWA Order M1100.1A delegates the approval authority to the FHWA Division Administrator.

Federal regulations <u>23 U.S.C. 101(a)(35)</u> and <u>23 U.S.C. 101(a)(36)</u> allow States and local officials to adjust urban and urbanized area boundaries; however, there is no Federal requirement for them to make these adjustments or to recalculate the population numbers if they chose to adjust the boundaries. If an urban area is within an MPO's MPA, local officials coordinate with their MPO and State DOT on the boundary adjustment, per <u>23 CFR 470.103</u>. States, MPOs, and local

governments may choose to make boundary adjustments for a variety of reasons, including, but not limited to:

- Aligning urban area boundaries with existing planning boundaries (e.g., MPA boundaries, local municipal boundaries)
- Addressing irregularities in urban area boundary shapes
- Maintaining consistency with highway functional classifications
- Including transit routes and/or traffic generators
- Incorporating local knowledge of urban form (e.g., current and future land use)
- Fostering an inclusive, effective, and comprehensive transportation planning process

Federal funding that the ACOG MPO receives is tied to the urban area definition by the Census Bureau and not the adjusted urbanized area. Staff has the urban area as defined by the Census Bureau (Map 1) and has developed a preliminary adjusted urbanized area map (Map 2). Generally, staff moved the boundary out to the next section line road.



INFORMATION:

ACOG opened the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program for the Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Call for Projects on September 1, 2023.

Cities, counties, and transportation agencies located within the ACOG MPO area are invited to submit projects for FFY 2026 and FFY 2027 funding consideration. **The application deadline is 4:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 31, 2023.**

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:

- All projects must be located on a functionally classified road, with the exception of bridge projects. Projects located on federal or state highways, interstates, or toll roads are ineligible.
- All projects must be included in, or consistent with, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (Encompass 2045).
- All projects must be in compliance with the <u>ACOG Complete Streets Policy</u>.
- Only submit projects for which local match funds and other local expenses associated with
 the projects will be available, and environmental clearance, right-of-way acquisition, and
 utility and encroachment clearance have been, or will be, accomplished within the federal
 fiscal year that the STBG-UZA funds are made available for obligation (approved by ODOT
 and FHWA).

APPLICATION SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- **ProjectTracker** (formerly eTRACKER) application form for each project, which identifies the proposed funding source(s) and amount(s).
- STBG-UZA Programming Resolution (with original signatures or a certified copy), adopted at a public meeting of its governing body, which describes the location of the project, type of improvement, total project cost, and source(s) of funds (a sample format is available from ACOG).
- Itemized cost estimate (construction costs, +6% ODOT E&C, design/engineering optional) for each project submitted, signed, stamped, and prepared by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Cost estimates must be dated within 6 months of the upcoming application submission deadline. Costs associated with right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation are not eligible; they are the responsibility of the sponsoring entity.

- Map of each project showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to ProjectTracker.
- The appropriate **2023 Project Rating Worksheet(s)** for each application requesting STBG-UZA funds. Projects with multiple aspects, such as a widening with intersection improvements, are required to have a completed Project Rating Worksheet for each component. Please complete a separate Project Rating Worksheet for each project submission using the correct project type.
- ODOT Project Scoping Form for each project.
- Any supporting documentation listed in the STBG-UZA Application Guidebook that supports the project score on the Project Rating Worksheet(s).

In order to be eligible for STBG-UZA funding, all prospective applicants must fill out a preapplication form for each project by **4:00 p.m. Friday, September 15, 2023**. The pre-application form is available at: https://arcg.is/WKuum.

A completed CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey must be submitted by the Call for Projects deadline in order to be considered for funding. The CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey is available for download at: Network Monitoring Survey CY 2022 (excel file).

STBG-UZA applications that are submitted without a corresponding pre-application and completed CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey will not be accepted. All required documents must be uploaded by the application deadline.

Regional Air Quality Plan

ACOG has competitively procured Reagan Smith, LLC and MHT Consulting, LLC to develop a Regional Air Quality Plan (RAQP).

With this plan, ACOG seeks to better understand current air quality status and sources of emissions, what other regions are doing to improve air quality, private sector emissions reduction strategies, transportation sector emissions reduction plans, policy and funding opportunities, equity considerations and environmental justice, as well as action and implementation items.

The study covers the eight-county Oklahoma City-Shawnee Combined Statistical Area (CSA) which includes the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) and the Shawnee Micropolitan Statistical Area.

Climate Pollution Reduction Grant

ACOG anticipates receiving an EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG), funded through the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). Earlier this year, EPA approved ACOG's Notice of Intent to Participate as the lead organization for the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). The CPRG is a \$1 million, four-year planning grant which entails ACOG developing a greenhouse gas (GHG) inventory, quantified GHG reduction measures, and a low-income and disadvantaged communities' benefits analysis. By participating in the grant program, ACOG member cities and counties will be able to compete for \$4.6 billion in EPA grant funding to implement measures from the GHG emissions reduction plan.


In August 2007, the Regional Snow Routes Committee was formed to assist in the interjurisdictional coordination of snow and ice management activities throughout the ACOG MPO area. The committee was tasked to develop a regional map that highlights the best route choices for motorists during winter storm events. As a result, a network of regional snow routes was established, and the related regional map was made available to the public via websites and press releases. This system of regional snow routes assists in providing better service and increased safety for all travelers within the region, including emergency vehicles, school buses, public transportation, and commercial vehicle traffic.

Since the 2022-2023 winter season, some snow route changes may have occurred at the local level. As the 2023-2024 winter season approaches, ACOG MPO member entities are asked to review the current regional snow routes and determine if additional changes or updates are needed.

It is critical that the regional snow routes map accurately reflects local snow route plans to ensure consistent public information. Should significant regional gaps arise due to the requested changes, the Regional Snow Routes Committee may be convened to resolve emerging issues.
