6. Transportation News and Update Report: John Sharp, Deputy Director

#### **Oklahoma Transportation**

ACOG staff met with Representative Nicole Miller, Representative Preston Stinson, and Edmond Councilmember Tom Robbins to discuss Central Oklahoma transportation issues. They wish to coordinate further on the transportation projects and legislation.

#### Surface Transportation Block Grant

The funding application process started September 1, and ACOG has been meeting with several communities to discuss their projects. This month ACOG asked ODOT staff to provide an overview of the project development process that takes place between ODOT, contract engineers, and local staff. The timeline for each project really depends on what type of project is submitted. Less complicated projects tend to be 18 months and more complex projects can take up to 48 months to clear for letting.

#### Pedestrian Safety Month

ACOG is currently planning activities for safety month in October.

#### **Climate Pollution**

ACOG, INCOG, and ODEQ have been coordinating on the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant from Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). This is a four-year, \$1 million grant. A Priority Climate Action plan is due March 1, 2024, and a Comprehensive Climate Action Plan is due in the summer of 2025. In April 2024, \$4.6 billion in implementation grants will be available. ACOG is still receiving details from EPA, so ACOG will continue to provide information regarding eligible projects.

#### Air Quality

ACOG staff has been receiving requests from the media for air quality background information. Last week, ACOG was interviewed by OETA. This week, ACOG was interviewed with KGOU NPR radio station and Eric Pollard had an interview with KOCO this morning.

#### Department of Defense

ACOG had a meeting with the Department of Defense and their consultants to discuss the Power Projection Platform. This is the coordination of the routes from specific military bases to ports. One of the main routes discussed was the route from Ft. Riley in Kansas to Port Arthur, Texas. Primarily on I-134, I-35, I-45, and over to Port Arthur. They are gathering information on congestion, bridge issues, construction, and maintenance in Oklahoma and specifically Central Oklahoma.

ACOG opened the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program for the Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Call for Projects on September 1, 2023.

Cities, counties, and transportation agencies located within the ACOG MPO area are invited to submit projects for FFY 2026 and FFY 2027 funding consideration. **The application deadline is 4:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 31, 2023.** 

#### PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:

- All projects must be located on a functionally classified road, with the exception of bridge projects. Projects located on federal or state highways, interstates, or toll roads are ineligible.
- All projects must be included in, or consistent with, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (Encompass 2045).
- All projects must be in compliance with the <u>ACOG Complete Streets Policy</u>.
- Only submit projects for which local match funds and other local expenses associated with the projects will be available, and environmental clearance, right-of-way acquisition, and utility and encroachment clearance have been, or will be, accomplished within the federal fiscal year that the STBG-UZA funds are made available for obligation (approved by ODOT and FHWA).

#### APPLICATION SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- **ProjectTracker** (formerly eTRACKER) application form for each project, which identifies the proposed funding source(s) and amount(s).
- STBG-UZA Programming Resolution (with original signatures or a certified copy), adopted at a public meeting of its governing body, which describes the location of the project, type of improvement, total project cost, and source(s) of funds (a sample format is available from ACOG).

**Itemized cost estimate** (construction costs, +6% ODOT E&C, design/engineering optional) for each project submitted, signed, stamped, and prepared by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Cost estimates must be dated within 6 months of the upcoming application submission deadline. Costs associated with right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation are not eligible; they are the responsibility of the sponsoring entity.

- Map of each project showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to ProjectTracker.
- The appropriate **2023 Project Rating Worksheet(s)** for each application requesting STBG-UZA funds. Projects with multiple aspects, such as a widening with intersection improvements, are required to have a completed Project Rating Worksheet for each component. Please complete a separate Project Rating Worksheet for each project submission using the correct project type.
- **ODOT Project Scoping Form** for each project.
- Any supporting documentation listed in the STBG-UZA Application Guidebook that supports the project score on the Project Rating Worksheet(s).

In order to be eligible for STBG-UZA funding, all prospective applicants must have submitted a preapplication form for each project by 4:00 p.m. Friday, September 15, 2023.

A completed CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey must be submitted by the Call for Projects deadline in order to be considered for funding. The CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey is available for download at: <u>Network Monitoring Survey CY 2022 (excel file)</u>.

# STBG-UZA applications that are submitted without a corresponding pre-application and completed CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey will not be accepted. All required documents must be uploaded by the application deadline.

#### **Regional Air Quality Plan**

ACOG has competitively procured Reagan Smith, LLC and MHT Consulting, LLC to develop a <u>Regional Air Quality Plan (RAQP)</u>.

With this plan, ACOG seeks to better understand current air quality status and sources of emissions, what other regions are doing to improve air quality, private sector emissions reduction strategies, transportation sector emissions reduction plans, policy and funding opportunities, equity considerations and environmental justice, as well as action and implementation items.

The study covers the eight-county Oklahoma City-Shawnee Combined Statistical Area (CSA) which includes the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) and the Shawnee Micropolitan Statistical Area.

#### **Climate Pollution Reduction Grant**

ACOG anticipates receiving an <u>EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG)</u>, funded through the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). Earlier this year, EPA approved ACOG's Notice of Intent to Participate as the lead organization for the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). The CPRG is a \$1 million, four-year planning grant which entails ACOG developing a greenhouse gas (GHG) inventory, quantified GHG reduction measures, and a low-income and disadvantaged communities' benefits analysis. By participating in the grant program, ACOG member cities and counties will be able to compete for \$4.6 billion in EPA grant funding to implement measures from the GHG emissions reduction plan.

## **INFORMATION:**

In August, the preliminary FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was presented for review and comment. The preliminary TIP was developed with input from ACOG MPO local governments, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Central Oklahoma Transportation and Parking Authority (COTPA), Norman Transit, the Oklahoma City Department of Airports, and other area airport operators.

The TIP identifies all federally funded surface transportation projects expected to be carried out by city, county, state, and local transportation agencies during federal fiscal years 2024-2027. This includes upcoming state-sponsored projects within the ACOG MPO area, under the jurisdiction of ODOT, upcoming transit projects provided by COTPA and Norman Transit, and proposed airport improvements provided by local airport operators.

Opportunity for public review and comment on the preliminary FFY 2024-2027 TIP was provided and no written comments were received by the September 20, 2023, deadline.

## Prior to action by the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, a public hearing will need to be opened, and comments received from any public in attendance.

The ACOG MPO Technical Committee has recommended that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve the final FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO TIP, which will then be provided to the ODOT for approval (as the Governor's designee) and incorporated into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The new TIP will become effective at the start of the federal fiscal year on October 1, 2023.

# ADJUSTED URBANIZED AREA BOUNDARY - 2020 CENSUS DEFINITIONS AND PROGRAMMATIC IMPACT

## **INFORMATION:**

Following each decennial census, the U.S. Census Bureau designates "urban areas" for statistical purposes. A list of the 2020 urban areas can be found in the December 29, 2022 Federal Register. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) uses the term "urbanized area" to mean an area with a population of 50,000 or more designated by the Census Bureau.

These are the following FHWA programs that are impacted by the urbanized area boundary (at the state level):

- Highway Functional Classification (Urban/Rural)
- HPMS Reporting
- Critical Freight Corridors
- STBG Apportionment Formula
- STBG Special Rule for Areas Less Than 50,000
- CMAQ Traffic Congestion Performance Measures
- Control of Outdoor Advertising

The following planning issues are addressed by the Federal Highway Administration:

At a minimum, the MPO boundaries shall encompass the entire existing urbanized area (as defined by the Census Bureau) plus the contiguous area expected to become urbanized within a 20-year forecast period for the metropolitan transportation plan, per <u>23 CFR 450.312(a)(1)</u>. Therefore, it is most likely that the MPO would need to include the entire adjusted urbanized area.

The determination to adjust an urban area boundary is a State and local decision that should be made cooperatively between State and local officials and MPOs if the boundary is located within an MPO's MPA. Urban area boundary adjustments are subject to approval by the Secretary of Transportation, per 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(35) and 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(36), but FHWA Order <u>M1100.1A</u> delegates the approval authority to the FHWA Division Administrator. Federal regulations 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(35) and 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(36) allow States and local officials to adjust urban and urbanized area boundaries; however, there is no Federal requirement for them to make these adjustments or to recalculate the population numbers if they chose to adjust the boundaries. If an urban area is within an MPO's MPA, local officials coordinate with their MPO and State DOT on the boundary adjustment, per 23 CFR 470.103. States, MPOs, and local

governments may choose to make boundary adjustments for a variety of reasons, including, but not limited to:


- Aligning urban area boundaries with existing planning boundaries (e.g., MPA boundaries, local municipal boundaries)
- Addressing irregularities in urban area boundary shapes
- Maintaining consistency with highway functional classifications
- Including transit routes and/or traffic generators
- Incorporating local knowledge of urban form (e.g., current and future land use)
- Fostering an inclusive, effective, and comprehensive transportation planning process

Federal funding that the ACOG MPO receives is tied to the urban area definition by the Census Bureau and not the adjusted urbanized area. Staff has the urban area as defined by the Census Bureau (Map 1) and has developed a preliminary adjusted urbanized area map (Map 2). Generally, staff moved the boundary out to the next section line road.


This item was brought before the ACOG MPO Technical and Policy Committees in August for their review and comments. The ACOG MPO Technical Committee has recommended approval.
