A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Brian Grider called the meeting to order at 1:35 p.m. A quorum was present. He welcomed all in attendance.

D. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE ACOG MPO POLICY COMMITTEE ACTION

1. **Public Hearing and Action** on Final FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP): Jennifer Sebesta, TPS Division Manager

Jennifer Sebesta highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum, noting that this item was presented last month for review. She said the public comment period was open until September 20, 2023, and no written comments were received.

Chairperson Brian Grider opened the public hearing. There being no response from the public, the public hearing was closed.

Councilmember David Bennett made a motion to approve the Final FFY 2024-2027 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program and submit the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation for approval and incorporation into the Statewide

Transportation Improvement Program. Mayor Terry Arps seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Adjusted Urbanized Area Boundary – 2020 Census Definitions and Programmatic impact: John Sharp, Deputy Director

John Sharp highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. He said the “smoothing” does not affect the transportation planning for the region; it just defines the adjusted urban boundary, which is used more for functional classification (urban/rural roadways), as well as other factors that are required at the state level.

Councilmember Stephen Holman made a motion to approve the proposed adjusted urbanized area map for transportation planning purposes. Mayor Phil Freeman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Transportation News and Update Report: John Sharp, Deputy Director

I-35 Widening

ACOG staff met with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) Chief Engineer to discuss the I-35 widening project south of Norman to the Red River in response to Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) expanding their portion of the I-35.

Safe Street and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant

ACOG has reviewed several applications and held interviews with two of the top consultants. The item will be discussed in the ACOG Board meeting. ACOG staff was also asked to assist Oklahoma City with their selection of a consultant for their SS4A grant.

Quarterly MPO Coordination Meeting

ACOG staff attended the quarterly MPO, FHWA, FTA, and ODOT coordination meeting. These meetings are scheduled to discuss grant funding issues and guidelines. There was also a discussion with the ODOT Comptroller, and she explained what we had in our various federal program accounts versus what was available to award to projects. We also discussed the issue of a government shut down and she assured us that our transportation funding would be fine.

Pedestrian Safety Month

October is designated Pedestrian Safety Month and ACOG has several events and functions scheduled for the month. ACOG flyers are on the agenda table.

Safe Oklahoma Summit

The state is holding a statewide safety conference at the Embassy Suites on October 4, 2023. It is free and ODOT anticipates that there will be 300-400 in attendance.

Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG)

ACOG is coordinating with INCOG and ODEQ to discuss the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant process. The deadline for the first plan, the Priority Climate Action (PCAP), is March 1, 2024, which is challenging, especially as EPA is slowly providing information on what we need to include in the report. EPA has also released the Notice of Funding Opportunity for the CPRG Implementation Grants. The deadline for the Notice of Intent to Apply is February 1 and final applications are due April 1. We are having some preliminary discussions on running an ACOG grant application process of \$10-20 million.

Air Quality Small Grant & Public Fleet Conversion Grant Programs

Calls for projects close tomorrow, September 29, 2023.

Tribal Clean Summit Grant

ACOG staff member Eric Pollard is a panelist at the Summit at the University of Oklahoma Native Nations Center. He will be discussing collaborations with tribes on various ACOG grants including Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG).

Training Workshop

ACOG's Air Quality staff participated in the 2023 Clean Cities Training Workshop and Department of Energy Clean Cities 30th Anniversary Stakeholder Summit in McClean, VA.

Department of Clean Energy Grant

ACOG is receiving grant funding for the Department of Energy Clean Energy to Communities (C2C) program. David Frick from ACOG's staff is working with the Frontier MPO staff on electric vehicles community readiness as part of the grant.

Clean Cities Interns

John Sharp introduced Madison Martin, who is a student at the Oklahoma City Community College. Judith Ntim is a summer intern staying on for the fall semester.

Regional Snow Routes

John Sharp requested the committee to please give ACOG their updates on the regional snow routes in their community. ACOG would like to finalize this map in October.

INFORMATION:

ACOG opened the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program for the Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Call for Projects on September 1, 2023.

Cities, counties, and transportation agencies located within the ACOG MPO area are invited to submit projects for FFY 2026 and FFY 2027 funding consideration. **The application deadline is 4:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 31, 2023.**

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:

- All projects must be located on a functionally classified road, with the exception of bridge projects. Projects located on federal or state highways, interstates, or toll roads are ineligible.
- All projects must be included in, or consistent with, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (Encompass 2045).
- All projects must be in compliance with the [ACOG Complete Streets Policy](#).
- Only submit projects for which local match funds and other local expenses associated with the projects will be available, and environmental clearance, right-of-way acquisition, and utility and encroachment clearance have been, or will be, accomplished within the federal fiscal year that the STBG-UZA funds are made available for obligation (approved by ODOT and FHWA).

APPLICATION SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- **ProjectTracker** (formerly eTRACKER) application form for each project, which identifies the proposed funding source(s) and amount(s).
- **STBG-UZA Programming Resolution** (with original signatures or a certified copy), adopted at a public meeting of its governing body, which describes the location of the project, type of improvement, total project cost, and source(s) of funds (a sample format is available from ACOG).
- **Itemized cost estimate** (construction costs, +6% ODOT E&C, design/engineering optional) for each project submitted, signed, stamped, and prepared by a registered professional engineer licensed in the State of Oklahoma. Cost estimates must be dated within 6 months of the upcoming application submission deadline. Costs associated with right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation are not eligible; they are the responsibility of the sponsoring entity.

- **Map of each project** showing its location, termini, street name(s), north arrow, and names of nearby major streets. Projects may be mapped in or uploaded to ProjectTracker.
- The appropriate **2023 Project Rating Worksheet(s)** for each application requesting STBG-UZA funds. Projects with multiple aspects, such as a widening with intersection improvements, are required to have a completed Project Rating Worksheet for each component. Please complete a separate Project Rating Worksheet for each project submission using the correct project type.
- **ODOT Project Scoping Form** for each project.
- Any supporting documentation listed in the STBG-UZA Application Guidebook that supports the project score on the Project Rating Worksheet(s).

In order to be eligible for STBG-UZA funding, all prospective applicants must have submitted a pre-application form for each project by 4:00 p.m. Friday, September 15, 2023.

A completed CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey must be submitted by the Call for Projects deadline in order to be considered for funding. The CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey is available for download at: [Network Monitoring Survey CY 2022 \(excel file\)](#).

STBG-UZA applications that are submitted without a corresponding pre-application and completed CY 2022 Network Monitoring Survey will not be accepted. All required documents must be uploaded by the application deadline.

INFORMATION:

On January 31, 2023, ACOG was awarded a \$192,000 Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) federal grant to develop a safety action plan. ACOG will contribute \$48,000 in funds as a 20 percent match for this \$240,000 project. A Regional Safety Action Plan is a vital endeavor for Central Oklahoma. By establishing a framework, identifying priority areas, and implementing evidence-based strategies, ACOG aims to reduce crashes, injuries, and fatalities, ultimately ensuring the safety and well-being for Central Oklahomans.

On August 1, 2023, ACOG released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a consultant to develop a Regional Safety Action Plan (RSAP) for Central Oklahoma. ACOG was seeking proposals from qualified and experienced firms to collect, produce, and analyze information to create the RSAP for the ACOG Transportation Management Area (TMA).

Three prospective firms responded to the RFP with detailed proposals, which were reviewed by ACOG staff for pricing and thoroughness. Upon final assessment, [Kimley-Horn](#) (consultant overview) was determined to have the best proposal and was chosen for the project at the September ACOG Board of Directors meeting.

The total cost for the ACOG RSAP project is \$240,000 and will take approximately 12 months to complete.

INFORMATION:

At the February meeting, the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approved the FY 2023 CRRSAA Recommended Project Award list. Project selections were chosen based on quality, need, and ability for the project to be completed within the federally allotted timeframe. All projects must be designed and have environmental reviews completed by September 30, 2024.

The Town of Jones City was awarded \$500,000 for an overlay project on Hiwassee Rd. from E Britton Rd. to NE 122nd St. (2 miles).

On September 11, ACOG received an email from the Town of Jones City requesting the project be moved to Britton Rd. from the Jones City city limits to Westminster Rd. (0.5 miles). The proposed amended project is completely within the city limits of Oklahoma City and is a higher priority for the Town of Jones City.

The project type remains an overlay project, and the CRRSAA funding will not exceed the previously awarded \$500,000.

ACOG consulted with ODOT Local Governments Division staff on the project scope change. ODOT approved of the project scope change and wanted to make sure the project sponsors would remain aware of the time constraints and stay in contact with the City of Oklahoma City. As the project is still a priority for Jones City and would remain within the confines of the original award amount, ACOG staff and the ACOG MPO Technical Committee recommend the approval of the scope change.

CLIMATE POLLUTION REDUCTION GRANT (CPRG) UPDATE

INFORMATION:

EPA has announced two competitions for CPRG implementation grants – a general competition for applications from states, municipalities, tribes, tribal consortia, and territories, and a competition only for tribes, tribal consortia, and territories. Approximately \$4.3 billion in funding is available for the general competition. These competitions are open to entities that received planning grants (ACOG included) to develop Priority Climate Action Plans (PCAPs) under phase 1 of the CPRG program, as well as entities that did not directly receive a planning grant (ACOG members) that are applying for funds to implement measures included in an applicable PCAP. Eligible applicants may only apply for funding to implement measures contained in an applicable PCAP.

ACOG's PCAP for the OKC-MSA is due March 1, 2024. Implementation grant applications are due April 1, 2024.

ACOG staff is seeking input from ACOG MPO Policy Committee members on greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction measures (see [Notice of Funding Opportunity](#) for a list of examples) to be included in the ACOG PCAP, which would then be eligible for inclusion in an implementation grant application.
