A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Brian Grider called the meeting to order at 1:45 p.m. A quorum was present. He welcomed all in attendance.

B. APPROVAL OF THE SEPTEMBER 28, 2023 MINUTES

Councilmember Peter Hoffman moved to approve the September 28, 2023, minutes. Vice-Mayor Mike Fullerton seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

D. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE ACOG MPO POLICY COMMITTEE ACTION

1. Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Proposed Scope Change by the Town of Jones City: Hannah Nolen, AICP, TPS Mobility & Planning Manager

Hannah Nolen highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum.

Commissioner Mark Sharpton made a motion to approve the proposed CRRSAA project scope change as requested by the Town of Jones City. Mayor Shelli Selby seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) Update: Eric Pollard TPS Air Quality & Clean Cities Manager

Eric Pollard said ACOG recently finalized its agreement with EPA to receive a \$1 million planning grant for the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant to create climate action plans for the Oklahoma City MSA, which extends a little beyond ACOG's current boundaries. He said the Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) is due March 1, 2024. EPA has also released a Notice of Funding Opportunity for the CPRG Implementation Grant, that includes about forty-five climate pollution reduction measures that would be eligible for funding. ACOG's intent is to lead an application process and submit an application by April 1, 2024, with our cities, counties, and stakeholders within the region. The State is also planning to submit an application by April 1 for those implementation measures, so ACOG is working closely with the State, having weekly coordination calls with them. Mr. Pollard encouraged the committee to look at the list of forty-five eligible items that

are linked in the agenda memorandum. The list includes transportation projects, as well as energy efficiency for city and county operations, agriculture, water, and wastewater projects. There are a couple of caveats: EPA does not want to fund projects that already have funding streams, so this is about identifying projects within their cities and counties that do not have any current funds available.

Mr. Pollard said there will be an Air Quality Advisory Committee meeting on Tuesday, November 7, at 10 a.m. to have an initial conversation about some of the projects they might be interested in including in the application package. He said the measures must be included in the PCAP to match the implementation items ACOG ends up pursuing.

3. Transportation News and Update Report: John Sharp, Deputy Director

STBG Projects

ACOG had several meetings and correspondence with member communities to discuss and clarify their STBG projects. All applications must be completed by October 31, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. Next is the scoring of the projects and meeting with ODOT staff to verify the scope of the projects and cost estimates. There are seventy-seven pre-applications that have met the grant requirements.

City of Mustang

ACOG hosted a meeting with the City of Mustang and ODOT staff to discuss a traffic light on Mustang Road, also known as State Highway 4. It was a positive meeting, and it looks like the project can move forward.

Public Fleet/Air Quality Grants

There is \$8.7 million available in federal funding for these grants. ACOG staff are currently scoring the applications submitted.

Clean Transportation

Eric Pollard presented on Central Oklahoma clean transportation deployment to a United Kingdom Economic & Trade Relations delegation on October 24, 2023. This was a meeting to discuss executed economic development MOU between United Kingdom government and the state of Oklahoma.

Electric School Bus

ACOG staff hosted school district transportation fleet directors, utilities, and vendors in a discussion about electric school bus microgrid and V2X pilot projects in Oklahoma.

OG&E

ACOG staff held a coordination meeting with OG&E representatives on funding opportunities for ACOG cities and counties within the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and Inflation Reduction Act (IRA).

Safe Oklahoma Summit

ACOG staff attended the safety summit, which had over 300 in attendance. There were sessions covering: distracted driving, teen drivers' safety, rail transit safety, traffic incidents. Jose Jimenez gave a presentation on our Watch For Me Ok campaign. He was swamped afterwards with questions and interest from attendees.

Regional Safety Action Plan

ACOG has chosen Kimley-Horn to work on the plan. This project should take about a year, and we will be bringing regular updates to this committee. This is another plan that is required by the feds, so that your communities can apply for safety grant funding.

Pedestrian Safety Month

October is Pedestrian Safety Month and ACOG has been involved in several events to promote safety. The Street Project screening was held at the Downtown Library, and it was well attended. A viewing of the documentary was shown first and then a panel discussion was held concerning the documentary and local safety issues. We were fortunate to have three Oklahoma City policy officers at the event and they were very helpful answering questions for attendees.

ACOG received four Pedestrian Safety Month Proclamations for Edmond, Moore, Norman, and Oklahoma City. Remember each trip starts and finishes as a pedestrian.

Bike Summit

The staff attended the Bike Summit at Rose State College. The event was kicked off by Mayor Dukes. He shared with the attendees that he was once part of the bicycle patrol in Midwest City. This event also coincided with the opening of the Bomber Rail Trail extension, as Midwest City continues to add to it trail network using TAP funds.

Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT)

ACOG had a meeting with ODOT staff to discuss HB 2752 that was introduced by Representative Miller last year. The bill stalled and ACOG staff was asked for suggestions to clarify the wording for the safe crossing and traffic lights sections.

Aerial Photography

Each year ACOG conducts a group buy for aerial photography, which can also include the collection of detailed engineering information like contours and elevation data. If your community would like to be involved in the project, please contact Jennifer Sebesta.

Every year, COKCC submits to the US Department of Energy (DOE) an annual report of its activities and accomplishments for the previous calendar year.

ACOG staff provides data to the National Renewable Energy Lab (NREL) on the sales of alternative fuels, deployment of alternative fuel vehicles and hybrid electric vehicles, idle-reduction initiatives, fuel economy activities, and programs to reduce vehicle miles traveled.

NREL and DOE analyze the data and translate them into fuel conservation and emission reduction impacts for ACOG and COKCC.

In 2022, the coalition reported the following:

- 6,800 pounds of nitrogen oxides (NOx) reduced; 74,852 pounds of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) reduced
- 13.6 million gallons of gasoline equivalent reduced
- 33,014 tons of greenhouse gases reduced

INFORMATION:

The FY 2024 funding cycle of the ACOG Air Quality Small Grant Program closed Friday, September 29, 2023. The program is designed to fund air quality related transportation infrastructure projects and congestion relief efforts. With \$4,355,362 available via Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) and Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) funds, ACOG received 19 applications requesting over \$7.1 million.

Applications were reviewed and scored by a committee consisting of ACOG TPS staff and representatives from the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT).

Projects selected for funding can be found in the table on the following page. The top 10 scoring projects are recommended to be funded in full, at a total of \$3,632,643. ACOG recommends that the remaining \$722,719 be allocated to the next highest scoring project, NE 16th St Sidewalks in Oklahoma City, for partial funding. Any additional funding that becomes available should be made available to the NE 16th St Sidewalks project and/or be rolled into the funding pot for the next Call for Projects.

The ACOG MPO Technical Committee has recommended approval of the attached list of projects.

2023 OZONE SEASON UPDATE

INFORMATION:

During the 2023 Ozone Season (April through November) there were twelve (12) Ozone Alert Days and fourteen (14) instances of monitors exceeding the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) ozone standard of 70 ppb.

The 2023 regional design value for Central Oklahoma is 73 ppb - a violation of the ozone standard.

EPA's ozone pollution standard uses a three-year average to determine compliance and the current standard is set at 70 ppb. At the end of the 2022 ozone season, the three-year average was 71 ppb. This means that if EPA were to designate the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA's) ozone attainment today, the OKC-MSA would be out of attainment of the ozone standard.

The <u>ACOG Cost of Nonattainment Study for the Oklahoma City Area</u> has estimated \$9.6 - \$15.2 billion in negative fiscal impact to the region if this were to occur.

CLIMATE POLLUTION REDUCTION GRANT (CPRG) UPDATE

INFORMATION:

EPA has announced two competitions for the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) implementation grants – a general competition for applications from states, municipalities, tribes, tribal consortia, and territories, and a competition only for tribes, tribal consortia, and territories – approximately \$4.3 billion in funding available. These competitions are open to entities that received planning grants (ACOG included) to develop Priority Climate Action Plans (PCAPs) under phase 1 of the CPRG Program, as well as entities that did not directly receive a planning grant (ACOG members) that are applying for funds to implement measures included in an applicable PCAP. Eligible applicants may only apply for funding to implement measures contained in an applicable PCAP. Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Reduction Measures Examples include:

- **Transportation** fleets, bicycle/pedestrian/mode shift, vehicle miles traveled (VMT) reduction
- **Electric Power** renewables, energy efficiency
- Buildings & Industrial energy codes, energy efficiency, electrification, energy performance
- Waste, Water, and Sustainable Materials Management reduced emissions from landfills and wastewater treatment facilities, waste diversion (reuse/recycling/composting)

ACOG staff is seeking input from MPO Policy Committee members on GHG reduction measures (see <u>Notice of Funding Opportunity</u> for a list of examples) to be included in the ACOG PCAP which would then be eligible as measures included in an implementation grant application.

ACOG's PCAP for the OKC-MSA is due March 1, 2024. Implementation grant applications are due April 1, 2024.
