MINUTES**1. CALL TO ORDER**

Presiding Chair Carrie Blumert called the meeting to order at 1:10 p.m. A quorum was present.

2. APPROVAL OF DECEMBER 14, 2023 MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING

Director Roger Godwin made a motion to approve the December 14, 2023 minutes. Director Terry Arps seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. COMMUNICATIONS:**A. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT - None**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Mark Sweeney said the passage of HB 1590 during the last Legislative Session increased the 911 Telephone Fees from 0.75 cents to \$1.25 for any device that dials 911. He said the new fee structure went into effect on November 1, 2023 and the additional revenue ACOG started receiving this month from the Oklahoma Tax Commission (OTC) is retroactive back to November. He said this explains why the distribution of funds was higher in January, for example, he said Midwest City received \$5,863.53 more this month compared to the December 2023 distribution. He said the amount to be refunded is still calculated on the 2018 Board approved formula of 18 cents of average 68 cents received from OTC (26.47%).

He said the amount will continue to vary as the new revenue flows in from OTC and will take time to settle into what will be the expected new normal. He said once that is determined, he will schedule a Board agenda item later this year to revisit the allocation method and to evaluate what is excess funding in the future.

In reference to the growth of the 911 ACOG Service Area, Mr. Sweeney said considering the technological advancements that Next Gen 911 brings to the ECC, 911 ACOG anticipates increased requests for membership to participate in and benefit from NG911. He said the ECCs and Communities in adjacent counties to the 911 ACOG Region are eligible to ask for membership. He said Blanchard Police Department was the last entity to request membership in 911 ACOG for NG911 benefits and was approved by the Board on May 27, 2021. He said two additional requests for 911 ACOG membership will be presented at the March or April Board meeting from Tinker Air Force Base for an 8-position Primary ECC and Piedmont Police Department for a 2-position Primary ECC.

Chair Blumert asked if a neighboring jurisdiction joins 911 ACOG is the membership only for 911 ACOG. Mr. Sweeney said that is correct. Director Steven Gentling asked if proactively expanding the boundaries would have economic benefits. Mr. Sweeney said to officially expand the territory, staff would have to go through legislation and that could lead to territorial and political issues. Director David Bennett asked if all the 911 systems are tied to a COG. Mr. Hawkinson said Oklahoma City and Tulsa are standalone entities. He said the City of Tulsa and INCOG have shared a system in the past.

Director Arps asked if a system has been established for call handling if any issues arose. Mr. Sweeney said the dispatching is done by the city or county. He said staff handles the technical and software support. He said staff would have more areas to service with added communities and eventually staffing would have to be expanded. Director Arps asked how far the expansion should stretch. Mr. Sweeney said that would be assessed through a strategic study utilizing our consultant, MCP. Director Arps asked if the ECCs can effectively operate in the event of a disaster. Mr. Hawkinson said the current system is designed with a disaster recovery plan, that the ECCs can utilize in the event of a disaster. Director Roger Gowin asked if any other COGs were implementing NextGen 911. Mr. Sweeney said no other COGs are implementing NextGen 911 in Oklahoma.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS OR DELEGATIONS

There were no comments from the public.

5. CONSENT DOCKET

Chair Blumert presented the Consent Docket, saying if Item 5-A does not meet with the approval of all Board of Directors, it will be heard in regular order.

- A. Finance Report – Authorization of Payments of December 2023 Claims
Director Terry Arps made a motion to approve the items under the consent docket.
Director Phil Freeman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOARD OF DIRECTORS ACTION

A. NG911 Implementation Status Report

Mr. Hawkinson highlighted the status as detailed in the memorandum regarding NG911 Implementation Status. He said 911 ACOG continues to work with NGA 911 to finalize a deployment schedule. He said 911 ACOG and NGA have resumed regular project meetings with the 1st meeting scheduled for February 7, 2024. He said staff continues to work with NGA 911 to finalize a deployment schedule, which will begin two weeks following the final ECC cutover to the Solacom Call Handling Solution.

Director Blumert asked how the cut over schedule is determined. Mr. Hawkinson said the schedule is geographically defined. He said with the completion of Warr Acres next week, cut group 1 will be cut over to Call Handling Solution. He said staff will continue with the other cut groups and cut over to the ESI net with the Next Generation Core Services, following a 2-week soak period. Mr. Sweeney said the 2-week soak period will go down to 1-week as staff starts to transition. In reference to EMSA, Director Vickie Douglas asked if there are other ambulance services that will be included in the implementation process. Mr. Hawkinson said the EMS contracts are between the municipality and the EMS provider. He said EMSA is the only EMS service provider that is a part of 911 ACOG.

Director Arps asked if Oklahoma City's facility would be able to communicate with 911 ACOG's Next Gen 911 system in the future. Mr. Hawkinson said the system would not have to be NENA (National Emergency Numbers Association) I3 compatible nor have ESI Net to be interoperable with 911 ACOG's NG911 system.

Director Marci White asked how the transition will affect mobile services. Mr. Hawkinson said the Rapid SOS feature tracks each call every 5 seconds. He said this is a part of the 911 system and continues to upload where the call is coming from and reports back to the dispatch center.

ECC Cut Group One: 911 staff have made final preparations for Warr Acres ECC Cutover, scheduled for January 30, 2024, completing ECC Cut Group One.

911 GIS:

911 GIS Operations: Daily Operations include cell tower routing updates, MSAG information updates, road additions/changes, and subdivision address range requests.

OKLAHOMA 911 INSTITUTE:

911 Institute Classes due to Solacom Guardian Training: Because of the new state mandates set by the O911MA, dispatchers hired after January 1, 2024, MUST have completed a 40-hour basic dispatch class before July 1, 2024. To meet this mandate, the Institute has scheduled 5 classes that are open only to 911 ACOG members. These classes will not be posted on the ACOG website, however all 911 ACOG ECCs have been notified of the

mandates and the required 40-hour basic (Public Safety Telecommunicator 1) course being made available for their dispatchers:

PST1: February 5 - February 9 - Yukon Police Department.

PST1: March 4 - March 8 & March 18 - March 22 - Logan County Sheriff's Office.

Sapulpa PD has reached out to the Institute and will begin sending their dispatchers to ACOG for training.

ECC CALL VOLUME STATISTICS:

Monthly ECC Call Volume Statistics are available for the Directors at the front table.

INFORMATION:

NGA Call Routing Solution and Solacom Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress staff and our vendors are making with implementing the Next Generation 911 (NG911) Program.

911 ACOG continues to work with NGA to finalize a deployment schedule, tentatively beginning two weeks following the final ECC cutover to the Solacom Call Handling Solution.

The following ECCs were successfully cutover to the Solacom Call Handling Solution:

- **Bethany - January 23, 2024**
- **Warr Acres - January 30, 2024**
- **Nichols Hills - February 6, 2024**
- **The Village - February 13, 2024**

With each ECC, non-service affecting issues were logged during and after the cutover process and resolved quickly.

Oklahoma County Sheriff's Office ECC is scheduled for cutover, Tuesday, February 27, 2024. ECC cutover status will be provided at the February 29 911 ACOG Board meeting.
