# **MINUTES-**

#### A. CALL TO ORDER

Dustin Downey called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. A quorum was present.

#### B. APPROVAL OF THE November 9, 2023, MEETING MINUTES

David Russell moved to approve the November 9, 2023, minutes. Erik Brandt seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

#### C. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION NLY:

#### 1. Envision Del City 2044

J. D. Hock gave a presentation on the Del City 2044 Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Hock said the City of Del City has worked with the consulting firm, Halff Associates, Inc. over the past year to develop a 20-year comprehensive plan that will guide the city's future growth and development. #### 2. ODOT Transportation Alternative (TA) Program

Hannah Nolen said for this grant, the communities must apply with a pre-application by the end of April. The final applications are due by the end of May. She then highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. She said new this year is that communities can only submit two applications. The cap is \$1.2 million per project, unless their population is under 5,000, then limited to \$700,000 per project.

#### 3. Oklahoma Route 66 Grant Program

Jennifer Sebesta highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. She said it does not look like a local match is required for this grant.

#### D. NEW BUSINESS

Danielle O'Neal with Yukon said they are expanding trails and walkways. One of their bigger projects is Garth Brooks Blvd. between Main and 10<sup>th</sup> Street. They are looking to add trails and trees in that area.

Emily Richey with Midwest City said they are working on the Comprehensive Plan for Midwest City. They sent out an RFP and four companies have responded so far.

Jan Fees with Edmond said Julianna McCullough is coordinating all the grants for Edmond. Ms. Fees said the Planning Director, Randy Entz, is now the new Assistant City Manager of Edmond. Also, their Human Resources Director is retiring.

David Russell with Mustang said they are focused on connecting all the trail systems in Mustang. They are working on the construction of 89<sup>th</sup> Street and Sara Road, which is a huge undertaking.

Michael Glessner with Noble said there is residential development going on in Noble. Noble is expanding their wastewater treatment plant and remodeling the Noble Police Station.

Bryan Balenseifen with Tuttle said there is residential growth going on with around 2,500

new homes. They continue to deal with infrastructure and planning issues.

Erik Brandt with Oklahoma County said the focus for them is the location of the County Jail.

Sasha McCrone with Oklahoma City said Vision Zero hired a consultant and the contract was approved. Construction has started on bike lane projects.

Joyce Green with Norman said they are working on a Comprehensive Plan update. The Senior Center opened and is very successful. Norman's Public Works Director retired recently.

Dustin Downey with Blanchard said they are looking at 1,300 new houses in the next five to seven years in Blanchard.

As a state affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, KOB organizes the annual Great American Cleanup in Oklahoma and provides materials and tools for communities and volunteers. KOB facilitates several other state-wide programs, including Litter Education, Paint Oklahoma Beautiful, and Lend-A-Bin.

Communities (cities and counties) can become a KOB Affiliate, which means a commitment from citizens, businesses, and civic leaders to work together to identify local concerns and correct them.

ACOG staff, members and KOB have collaborated over the years to advance shared missions to improve Oklahomans' quality of life with particular focus on solid waste management (increased recycling, composting, and landfill diversion) and placemaking (beautification, revitalizing public spaces, etc.) – working to identify funding opportunities and being a resource for citizens and policymakers alike.

KOB joins APTAC at the March meeting for a presentation and a discussion on the ways ACOG member cities and counties can participate in and benefit from KOB programs and services.

#### Oklahoma Recreational Trails Program (RTP) - Oklahoma Department of Tourism & Recreation

- Applications due March 31, 2024
- Projects require a 20 percent local match. Other sources of federal funds may also be used for the match up to 95 percent of the total project cost. Maximum project award will be \$300,000.

#### Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program - Oklahoma Department of Transportation

- Applications due May 31, 2024
- \$34 million is available statewide. Projects require a 20 percent local match, however, for communities under 5,000 in population, only a 10 percent match is required. Maximum project award for areas with populations over 5,000 will be \$1.2 million per project. Maximum project award for areas with populations less than 5,000 will be \$700,000 per project. Applicants are limited to two project applications.
