A. CALL TO ORDER

Dustin Downey called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. A quorum was present.

B. APPROVAL OF THE March 14, 2024, MEETING MINUTES

Jan Fees moved to approve the March 14, 2024, minutes. David Russell seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

1. Keep Oklahoma Beautiful

Evelyn Schaefer gave the committee a little history of her background working with non-profit organizations. Ms. Schaefer said Keep Oklahoma Beautiful (KOB) is a statewide nonprofit organization founded in 1965 and is a state affiliate of Keep America Beautiful.

As a state affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, KOB organizes the annual Great American Cleanup in Oklahoma and provides material and tools for communities and volunteers. KOB facilitates several other state-wide programs, including litter education, Paint Oklahoma Beautiful, and Lend-A-Bin.

Ms. Schaefer discussed ways ACOG member cities and counties can participate in and benefit from KOB programs and services.

2. 2024 Bike Month

Hannah Nolen highlighted the information provided in the agenda memorandum. Ms. Nolen reminded the committee that as in previous years, ACOG will design a flyer for communities showing bike routes and encouraging community bike rides. D. NEW BUSINESS

Erik Brandt with Oklahoma County said the location of the new county jail is their current focus.

Michael Glessner with Noble said there is new residential development and waterline development expansion. Noble is also working on a comprehensive plan.

Sasha McCrone with Oklahoma City said construction on bike lanes is still ongoing. Ms. McCrone said the Vision Zero project will be completed by the end of the year. She said the project on Lottie Blvd. will result in the city's first parking protected bike lane.

Petya Stefanoff with Midwest City said the city's biggest project is the sewer moratorium. She said they are in the process of updating the comprehensive plan, the last one was completed in 2008. Also, they are completing bond projects.

Sarah Huffine with Choctaw said they published a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Unified Building Development code. They currently have a moratorium on duplexes and multifamily development. They are also working on a utility master plan with Brandon Wolf, that will be completed by July 2024.

Kyle Gandy with Del City said they are getting their first bike lane along Bryant Avenue. They finished the walking trails around Eagle Lake. They are also updating the Del City comprehensive plan.

Julie Shannon with Yukon said they finished their development code in August of last year, Airbnb is a huge business and now they have had to figure out the permit process.

David Russell with Mustang said they have several new trails and sidewalk projects in the works. They are experiencing a commercial and residential development boom. Mustang is also rewriting their water and sewer code for construction development.

Jan Fees with Edmond thanked ACOG for the Regional Safety Summit. Edmond is updating their development code. They are working on new streetscape design standards and have new trails under construction.

Ken Nelson with The Village said they are updating their walking trails.

Dustin Downey with Blanchard said the city council passed two ordinances that made changes to the zoning code and are finally adopting changes to the landscaping regulations.

ACOG MPO TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT AREA 2020 POPULATION BY COUNTY AND CITY

INFORMATION:

ACOG staff is currently in the process of developing 2020 base data for the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). The MPO is required to develop a Plan update by the fall of 2026. The early work involves assembling land use and socioeconomic data for the base year (2020). This will be followed by utilizing scenario planning to allocate population and employment based on future development patterns and land use capacity.

At this time, the preliminary 2020 total population of 1,333,280 has been calculated at the regional, county, city, and traffic analysis zone (TAZ) level using block level data from the 2020 Census. The TMA boundary has changed since the last plan and so some additional portions of counties and cities have been added. The attached table lists the county and city population totals for 2010 and 2020, and for the 2020 TMA portions. The TAZ data can be viewed online. Click here to view the map and data. ACOG anticipates requesting approval of the data at the June ACOG MPO Technical and Policy Committee meetings. Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) - Federal Highway Administration

- Planning and Demonstration Grant applicants have three deadlines: April 4, May 16, and August 29, 2024

Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program (ATIIP) - Federal Highway Administration

- This grant program was created to plan, design, and construct infrastructure that will provide substantial additional opportunities for walking, bicycling, and other forms of active transportation.
- Eligible applicants include local or regional governmental organizations, multicounty special districts, states, or tribes.
- Applications are due June 17, 2024

Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program - Oklahoma Department of Transportation

- Applications due May 31, 2024
- \$34 million is available statewide. Projects require a 20 percent local match, however, for communities under 5,000 in population, only a 10 percent match is required. The maximum project award for areas with populations over 5,000 will be \$1.2 million per project. The maximum project award for areas with populations less than 5,000 will be \$700,000 per project. Applicants are limited to two project applications.
