MINUTES-

A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson John M. Sharp called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m. He introduced himself and entertained introductions of members, staff, and guests. There was a quorum.

B. APPROVAL OF THE SEPTEMBER 12, 2024, MINUTES

Brandon Bundy moved to approve the September 12, 2024, minutes. Nikkiey Morton seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

C. ACTION ITEMS:

1. Regional Safety Action Plan (RSAP) Presentation

John Sharp gave a presentation, which can be viewed <u>here</u>.

Mayor Terry Arps moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee adopt the Regional Safety Action Plan for the ACOG MPO. David Riesland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. ACOG MPO Technical Committee Meeting Schedule for CY 2025

John Sharp said the CY 2025 meeting dates for the ACOG MPO TC are listed in the agenda. There is no meeting in July. The meetings are at 10 a.m., usually on the second Thursday of the month.

Mayor Terry Arps moved to recommend that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve the proposed CY 2025 ACOG MPO Technical Committee meeting schedule. David Riesland seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

D. ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

1. Functional Classification Revisions for the ACOG MPO Area

Lauren Wood said there is an ArcGIS Online map available online. Committee members can add new, or edit existing, segments of the functional classification network. She said there is a step-by-step guide for how to make the requested changes linked in the agenda. They do not need an ArcGIS account to add segments, but if they have an account, they can make corrections later. Mr. Sharp said this is a slow process and in years past, if you added a functional classification mile, you had to delete a functional classification mile elsewhere, but that is not the case anymore. After submitting the request, it goes to ODOT, and then to FHWA, so it takes time to complete. He said ACOG would like to have this information back by 5 p.m. Monday, December 2, 2024.

Mayor Arps asked why Route 66 was not included. Mr. Sharp said interstates and highways are ODOT facilities, so they handle it.

Michael Glessner noted that a minor arterial road was added in his city and asked if there is a need to verify with traffic counts. Jennifer Sebesta said there is a link in the agenda to the FHWA Functional Classification Guidebook that should give a breakdown of what can be added.

The question was asked that if they have consecutive miles, should they submit those separately. Ms. Wood said yes, she had it set as segments in case one segment does not qualify, but they still want it. Mr. Sharp added that they may have different traffic counts on those two miles, so that may make a difference as well.

2. 2025 Oklahoma Recreational Trails Program

John Sharp highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum. This funding is for improvements within a designated park that they already have – trail work, trail heads, and it can be a phased approach. A council resolution is required as part of the grant application.

3. Projects in the ACOG MPO Transportation Management Area (TMA)

John Sharp said ODOT Local Government staff is here today if anyone has concerns or questions about any of their projects moving forward in their community.

He then referred to a handout that was at the front table, noting that TSET has their grants for local communities that opens on November 19 and goes through February 12. He said it is an opportunity to get funding for healthy facilities in their communities.

E. NEW BUSINESS

ODOT Local Government Staff Position Changes

Matt Mitchell, the Division Engineer for ODOT Local Government, said that Melissa Davis will now be the Asst. Division Engineer, Amber Mitchell will be filling Melissa Davis' old position as the FEMA Emergency Relief (ER) and Bridge Program Coordinator, Julianne Halliday will be moving to the District 7 area, and Christopher Gayle is the new ACOG Project Manager. Matt VanAuken will remain in his position as Program Manager.

ODOT Long Range Transportation Plan

Sarah McElroy said ODOT's Oklahoma Long Range Transportation Plan has a survey for priorities and policies over the next 25 years. The <u>survey link</u> is live and will go through December 20. It is also on social media and she requested that the committee share that information.

INFORMATION:

The following amendment has been proposed for the FFY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program:

The City of Oklahoma City has submitted a request to amend the FFY 2025 Transit Element of the FFY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Oklahoma City is requesting the amendment (see letter on next page) in order to program Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 20005b Pilot Program for Transit-Oriented Development Planning funds awarded to the city. The funds will be used to plan for transit-oriented development along the NW Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) line.

This amendment ensures consistency among the TIP, Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), and the grant awards. Upon approval of the ACOG MPO Policy Committee, the request will be forwarded to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) and then to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)/Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for final approval.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Consider recommending that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee amend the FFY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program by amending the FFY 2025 Transit Element to include the FTA Pilot Program for Transit-Oriented Development Planning funds awarded to the City of Oklahoma City, and submitting the same to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) for amendment of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

The City of Oklahoma City is requesting an amendment to the FFY 2025 TIP. Please place this request on the agendas for the next meeting of the ACOG MPO Technical Committee (TC) and the ACOG MPO Policy Committee (PC). The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) has notified the City of Oklahoma City that it will be the recipient of a TOD Pilot Study Grant in the amount of \$975,000. This grant will fund a corridor study of NW Classen Blvd. from NW 10th Street to NW 48th Street and include and affordable housing assessment, connectivity plan, and land use plan for the area around the EMBARK NW Rapid BRT stations. The plan will help guide a new city TIF for the area, additional street enhancement projects, and private developments along the corridor.

If this amendment is approved by the ACOG MPO TC and PC, we ask that it be forwarded to ODOT for inclusion in the STIP.

FFY 2028 SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT - URBANIZED AREA (STBG-UZA) PROJECT SELECTIONS

INFORMATION:

On July 1, 2024, the Association of Central Governments (ACOG) issued a Call for Projects for the Surface Transportation Block Grant - Urbanized Area (STBG-UZA) Program funds assigned to the ACOG MPO area. ACOG received 48 applications for this competitive grant program, requesting \$151,485,296 in federal STBG-UZA funding.

ACOG staff completed its review of the STBG-UZA applications, scoring sheets, and supporting documentation that were submitted by member entities. This process included verifying project components and scoring accuracy. A list of the submitted projects (with final, verified scores) is available at the following link: STBG-UZA FFY 2028 Projects_Matrix.

As with past years, an estimated apportionment of STBG-UZA has been developed in consultation with the Programs Division of the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT). These figures reflect the estimated STBG-UZA apportionment that are anticipated to be received in FFY 2028 (est. \$30,972,623). In addition to the yearly federal apportionment, ODOT is providing additional funding for this call for projects cycle, bringing the available federal funding for each year to \$40 million. Federal rules allow 10 percent of the estimated STBG distribution to be used to finance 100 percent of the construction of eligible safety projects. These funds will remain at 10 percent of the original federal apportionment amount.

The estimated annual STBG-UZA (80 percent federal) and STBG-UZA Safety (100 percent federal) funds are available on the next page in <u>Table 1</u>. The FFY 2028 STBG-UZA Recommended Project Award List is available in <u>Table 2</u>.

The remainder of the projects not selected for funding in FFY 2028 will be listed by score in FFY 2029 (unlocked year) of the upcoming FFY 2026-2029 ACOG MPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). These projects can be resubmitted for consideration in the next STBG-UZA Call for Projects. It should be noted that a year-of-expenditure inflation factor has been applied to the project cost estimates submitted by the project sponsors, as required by federal regulation. An inflation factor of 3 percent was used for FFY 2028.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Consider recommending that the ACOG MPO Policy Committee approve funding for the FFY 2028 STBG-UZA Recommended Project Award List.

2024 OZONE SEASON UPDATE

INFORMATION:

Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) staff will be at the December Technical Committee meeting to give an update on the 2024 ozone season (April through November). There were eleven (11) Ozone Alert Days and thirty-two (32) instances of monitors exceeding the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) ozone 8-hour standard of 70 ppb. The 2024 regional design value for Central Oklahoma was calculated at 76 ppb – a violation of the ozone standard.

EPA's ozone pollution standard uses a three-year average to determine compliance, and the current standard is set at 70 ppb. At the unofficial end of the 2024 ozone season, the regional three-year average was 72 ppb. This means that if EPA were to designate the Oklahoma City Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA's) ozone attainment today, the OKC-MSA would be out of attainment of the ozone standard.
