### **MPO Coordination**

In March, a quarterly meeting was held to discuss common issues for the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPOs), Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), and Federal Transit administration (FTA) staff. There are some retirements at the FHWA Oklahoma City office, and we learned of our new MPO contract at the meeting. ODOT and its consultants are currently working on the statewide 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). There will be a public meeting on April 29, at the ODOT Training Center located at N 122<sup>nd</sup> St. and I-35.

### **Aerial Photography**

The aerial photography for Edmond, Oklahoma City, and Norman has been flown. ACOG also purchased Cleveland County to be used as a resource for addressing. Sanborn, the contractor for the project, also offered to fly fire impacted areas for the same price per mile as we received for the projects. The Logan County Assessors are currently deciding whether they will go in this direction.

### National Association of Regional Councils (NARC)

ACOG staff attended a virtual meeting hosted by NARC this month. A great deal of the discussion centered around the new administration's rules and how Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) may have to modify what they have been doing in the past. ACOG is still waiting for clarification on several issues.

### **Clean Cities Interns**

Madison Martin and Kathryn Barber recently attended the first ever U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Clean Cities & Communities Accelerate Training Workshop at Argonne National Laboratory. David Frick, ACOG Air Quality & Clean Cities Planner III, also attended.

### City of Norman

With assistance from the ACOG Public Fleet Grant program, Norman recently deployed 21 hybrid electric police SUV units. We estimate that this will prevent 818 pounds of air pollution emissions annually. Idling vehicles help contribute to air pollution. If you are interested in applying for an electric vehicle, alternative fuel, or hybrid vehicle funding in the future, please reach out to David Frick from our staff.

### Air Quality Monitoring

In addition to the tragic loss of life and property during the wildfires and extreme winds earlier this month, you may have noticed the impact of dust and smoke on our air quality, reaching historic hazardous levels rarely seen. This event illustrated the importance of air quality monitoring and ACOG coordination with EPA and DEQ. Pollution levels those days will almost certainly be considered an extraordinary event that will not be included in future attainment designations. Kudos to ACOG Public Information Director (PID) Rachel Meinke and our Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) partners for getting the word out via social media to protect public health.

From November to December 2024, ACOG hosted an ArcGIS online map to allow member entities to submit functional classification changes to the road network. The main reasons for requesting changes were to reflect current traffic counts, increases in traffic generators along many classified roads, and revised information for the updated ACOG MPO Boundary. ACOG received functional classification changes from the Cities of El Reno, Noble, Norman, Oklahoma City, and Yukon. These changes will now go to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation for their review.

### **OZONE SEASON PREVIEW**

### **INFORMATION:**

Ozone season typically runs from April to October. During this season ACOG declares 'Ozone Alert Days' when the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) believes ozone pollution levels will be high.

In 2024, Central Oklahoma finished the ozone season with a design value of 0.076 (a violation of EPA's 0.070 ozone standard) and is exceeding a 0.070 three-year average. If EPA enforces the current ozone standard, the Oklahoma City Metro area would be out of attainment for ozone.

In addition, EPA has tightened the PM<sub>2.5</sub> standard which could impact Central Oklahoma's attainment status. However, there is active litigation challenging this tightening and the Trump administration has announced an intention to reconsider the standard.

Individuals with respiratory disease (COPD, asthma, emphysema), the elderly, and children with respiratory ailments are all at increased risk of health problems when ozone and PM<sub>2.5</sub> pollution reaches unhealthy levels.

ACOG members are invited to join ACOG staff to inform Central Oklahomans of ways they can protect public health and reduce emissions on Ozone Alert Days. Members are also encouraged to collaborate with ACOG staff to identify strategies for emissions reductions in their communities.

Members can help share air quality related social media posts from ACOG accounts, especially during Air Quality Awareness Week (May 5-9).
