MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

Presiding Chair Phil Freeman called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. A quorum was present.

2. APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 27, 2025, MINUTES

Director Steven Gentling made a motion to approve the February 27, 2025 minutes of the 911 ACOG Board of Directors Meeting. Director Shelli Shelby seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. COMMUNICATIONS:

A. **CHAIR'S REPORT** – None

B. **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT** – None

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS OR DELEGATIONS -

Director Darrell Davis introduced Hon. Maggie Murdock Nichols as new councilmember for the City of Edmond. Director Vickie Douglas introduced Hon. Judy Meyers as new councilmember for the City of Warr Acres.

5. CONSENT DOCKET

Presiding Chair Freeman presented the Consent Docket, saying if Item 5-A does not meet

with the approval of all Board of Directors, it will be heard in regular order.

A. Finance Report – Authorization of Payments of February 2025 Claims

Director Matt Dukes made a motion to approve the item under the consent docket. Director David Bennett seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

6. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE 911 ACOG BOD ACTION

A. 911 ACOG Board Officer Succession Process and Election of New Vice-Chair

Mark Sweeney said 911 ACOG Board Vice-Chair, Mayor Roger Godwin of Warr Acres, did not seek another term as mayor and therefore resigned from his officer position on February 18, 2025. He said in the event the chair resigns or is unable to serve in his/her position, the vice-chair will succeed to the office of chair and the secretary/treasurer will succeed to the office of vice-chair for the remainder of the term of office. He said in the event the vice-chair or secretary/treasurer resigns or is unable to serve in his/her position, the chair of the 911 ACOG BOD shall nominate a board member to fill the unexpired term of the vacancy. He said any vacancy may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors then in office. He said a Director elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his/her predecessor in office and until his/her successor is elected and qualified.

Mr. Sweeney said this provision would result in Mayor Larry Heikkila of the City of Norman, who is the current Secretary/Treasurer, succeeding to Vice-Chair. He said since Mayor Heikkila was not reelected in February and will be leaving the office at the end of June 2025, the priority will be to fill the vacant Vice-Chair position with a new person. He said in accordance with the Bylaws, Chair Phil Freeman is nominating Councilmember Kathy Griffith of the City of Moore to serve as Vice-Chair. He said if voted into this position by the Board, Councilmember Griffith will serve the unexpired term until June 30, 2025, and will be eligible to be elected again in May 2025 if nominated by the ACOG Nomination Committee for FY 2026.

Director Terry Arps made a motion to approve the election of Councilmember Kathy Griffith of the City of Moore, as nominated by the 911 ACOG Board Chair Mayor Phil Freeman of the City of Noble, to serve as the 911 ACOG Board Vice-Chair for the unexpired term until June 30, 2025, of the previous Vice-Chair. Director Mark Sharpton seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

B. NG911 Implementation Status Report

Mr. Hawkinson highlighted the information as detailed in the agenda memorandum regarding the NG911 Implementation Status Report. He said migration readiness testing is still in progress. He said the February 28 testing session was successful. He said final testing is planned for April 2, 2025, and the full deployment plan and timeline will be finalized once completed.

- NGA Next Generation Core Services (NGCS) Migration: Staff has been assisting with facilitating final end-to-end testing between NGA and Comtech at the TierPoint & MidCon Data Centers. Final end-to-end testing is scheduled for April 2, 2025.

911 GIS:

- 911 ACOG GeoDatabase Schema Conversion: GIS has provisioned the 911 ACOG GIS data for NGA regarding current and future GIS data uploads for NG911.
- GIS stays engaged in address and plat requests for local communities and consistently provides additional GIS updates.

OKLAHOMA 911 INSTITUTE:

- Communications Training Officer (CTO) Refresher: April 24 This one-day class is designed for current CTOs to go over the foundations for a successful training program. Topics include: Responsibilities of CTOs, CTO Program History, CTOs Responsibilities, Benefits of Standardized Training, DORs & SEGs, and Liability.
- APCO Public Safety Telecommunicator (PST) I: April 28 – May 2 The five-day PST course may be used for new-hire and existing employee training. The course blends the knowledge and skill building information needed for a basic telecommunicator with the most up-to-date information on the technology and issues in public safety communications centers.

INFORMATION:

NGA 911 Call Routing Solution and Comtech Call Handling Solution reports are provided as status updates to the progress 911 Staff and our vendors are making with implementing the Next Generation 911 (NG911) Program.

Testing of the networks by 911 ACOG, Comtech and NGA took place on February 28, 2025, and was successful. Final testing of the networks occurred on April 2nd, 2025, and unexpected modifications were required to complete some test cases. As a "top to bottom run without failure" did not occur, the tests were deemed unsuccessful.

MCP and 911 ACOG are working to finalize the test plan, and craft an amendment 5a to document the testing process and anticipated path forward.

Once the amendment and test plan are complete, testing of the networks will be scheduled.

The first Originating Service Provider (OSP) is tentatively scheduled to migrate two weeks after final testing of the network is successful. Full system acceptance is tentatively scheduled to occur approximately 16 weeks later.

911 ACOG continues to work with Tinker AFB and NGA to incorporate Tinker AFB into the NGA Call Routing Solution. Tinker AFB's timeline for cutover remains dependent on their completion of network connectivity.
